



First Down Facts



Did you know that when a Change of Placement (COP) TDM is held, a child is **28% more likely** to be able to remain in his or her current placement?

This chart shows us what happened to the 73 foster children affected by COP TDMs since 1/1/04.



Before moving a child from one home to another, here are some facts to consider about OUR children:

243 have experienced at least one Change of Placement during 2004

Of the **256** children who entered Foster Care to date in 2004, **37%** (95 children) have already experienced at least one placement change.

17% of all children who entered Foster Care in 2004 & have had multiple placements were initially placed with a relative. These children average 2 placements this year, with subsequent moves more likely to be to another relative's home.

37% of all children who entered Foster Care in 2004 & have had multiple placements were initially placed in a family Foster Home. They average 2.5 placements this year & are more likely to be moved to another Foster Home.



30% of all children who entered care in 2004 were initially placed in an Emergency Shelter. They average 3 placements so far this year & are more likely to move to family Foster Homes.




53 children (**22%**) have had **more than 5** placement changes since the time they entered Foster Care. On average, these children have had 8.5 placements during more than 4 years in Foster Care.

66% of children with **5 or more placements** have had more than 2 placements in residential, institutional, or emergency facilities.

•39% of all children who have entered foster care since January 2000 have never moved from their initial placement!


Population Comparisons: Foster Children vs. Macomb County

FOSTER CARE POPULATION BY AGE GROUP AT INITIAL PLACEMENT



Age: According to Census 2000 statistics, children under the age of 12 account for approximately 72% of Macomb County's total under 18 population. For the period of 2000 thru September 2004, 73% of all initial Foster Care placements are for children under the age of 12.

Gender: From 2000 thru 2004, 52% of all initial Foster Care placements are girls. Gender demographics from Census 2000 show that girls account for 48% of the under 18 population.




Race: Macomb County's race-based population demographics (all age groups) are as follows (Census 2000):

White: 93%
African American: 3%
Other: 4%

The following data represents the racial breakdown of all initial Foster Care placements for the period 2000 thru YTD 2004:

White: 82%
African American: 14%
Other: 4%



Now look at our MCFIA Licensed Foster Homes:


Age:

This chart represents a very rough breakdown of the # of MCFIA's Foster Homes by the age groups of children for whom they are licensed to supervise. Of all our licensed homes, 10% have been licensed to care for children between the ages of 0 & 17. Note that 73% of the children entering care are less than 12 years of age & that represents the largest # of available foster home beds.



We have some terrific Macomb County FIA-licensed Foster Homes. But, we are in **always** in need of homes that will provide care for our special needs children.

Macomb County FIA Foster Homes by Provider's Race




Race:

The racial composition of Macomb County FIA's licensed Foster Home providers is consistent with that of our Foster Care population as noted on the previous page.

Gender: 79% of all Macomb County FIA licensed Foster Homes have been licensed to care for children of either sex. Of the remaining homes, 14% care for only girls - 7% for only boys.

How much time do you spend in a TDM? The average TDM goes something like this:



The average TDM lasts 103 minutes from scheduled start to finish.

Coding Counts!

When a foster child is placed with a non-custodial parent and the case is subsequently closed, the correct closure reason is 'placed with a parent'. Using any other closure reason means that the closure won't count as a reunification, which it really is. If all 2004 Foster Care case closures showing a last placement of 'parental home' had been coded as 'placed with parent', Macomb County FIA's 2004 reunification rate would jump from **48% to 58%**!

Remember: Your manager is **always** the best resource when you need policy, practice, or process clarification.
